7. Joanna Malinowska, "Not a Metaphorical Forest" at CANADA

If you're wondering what happens to all the Christmas trees discarded on New York's city streets this year, well, some of them ended up in Joanna Malinowska's new exhibition. The work, *Still Life*, is,

according to the press release, “an attempt to reconstruct a beaver habitat.” In line with the artist’s appreciation of absurdity and skepticism of her fellow humans, a series of nine watercolors, *His Worshipers Worship a Phantom*, also deals with the deconstruction of trees. There’s also a sickle-shaped “leaning” sculpture, and a trashed copy of *The Brothers Karamazov*, for good measure.
