wee's Playhouse" and "Twin Peaks," it features an effervescent, operatic score by Hallet, a composer and an electronic musician. In the latest installment, projected here (you can also watch it online as a part of "First Look," a joint venture of Rhizome and the New Museum), Cynthia bathes in kaleidoscopic bubbles and dries herself with a magical towel, exercises with the aid of singing tchotchkes, and glides triumphantly up a redwood tree, seeking enlightenment.
